**About the Webinar:** S&B Engineers (and its insurers) settled a personal injury suit and then brought a contractual indemnification action against subcontractor Scallon. The parties had agreed Scallon would indemnify S&B for Scallon's own allocable negligence only. Scallon refused to contribute, arguing that it was never sued by the plaintiffs, that S&B never designated it as a responsible third party, and that the voluntary settlement on behalf of S&B only—and not Scallon—extinguished all claims. The trial and appellate court agreed. How do you preserve rights to pursue contractual indemnity after settlement? What does it mean for purposes of defending underlying personal injury suits? Will S&B v Scallon increase litigation, or streamline it? Hear what our panel of experts think.
